By your great mercy we have been born anew to a living hope \* through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled and unfading, \* kept in heaven for us, who are being protected by your power through faith, \* for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. We were ransomed from the futile ways of our ancestors \* not with perishable things like silver or gold but with the precious blood of Christ \* like that of a lamb without spot or stain. Through Christ we have confidence in your, O God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, \* so that our faith and hope are set on you. or A Song of God's Children (Romans 8.2, 14, 15b-19) The law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus \* has set us free from the law of sin and death. All who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God; \* for we have received the Spirit that enables us to cry, 'Abba, Father'. The Spirit bears witness that we are children of God \* and if God's children, then heirs of God; if heirs of God, then fellow-heirs with Christ; \* since we suffer with him now, that we may be glorified with him. These sufferings that we now endure \* are not worth comparing to the glory that shall be revealed. For the creation waits with eager longing \* for the revealing of the children of God.

# Affirmation of Faith The Apostles' Creed
